

MAKE YOUR PLAN TO VOTE



EXPLORE CANDIDATES AND BALLOT MEASURES

You can see candidates and ballot measures by viewing a sample ballot at vote.nd.gov/myvotinginfo.

Ballots in North Dakota have three sections:

- **Partisan Races:**
Federal, legislative, and statewide
- **No-Party Races:**
County, city, school, and other statewide non-partisan races
- **Ballot Measures:**
All measures brought forward by the legislature, local jurisdictions, or by the public petition process

If you are a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old, and have lived in North Dakota for 30 days prior to Election Day, you have the right to vote!

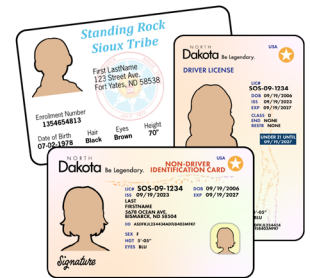
PREPARE

North Dakota does not require voter registration, but you do need to have a valid form of identification to vote.

IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

One of the following forms of ID is required for all voting options - absentee, early vote, on Election Day.

- North Dakota Driver's License
- North Dakota Non-Driver ID
- Tribal ID or Tribal Letter
- Long-term Care Certificate



ENSURE YOUR ID IS UP-TO-DATE

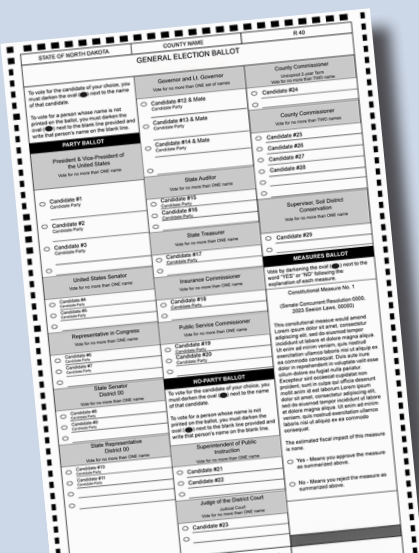
For North Dakota driver's licenses and non-driver IDs issued by the North Dakota Department of Transportation, you can update your ID address and make appointments online for new IDs. Use the QR codes or call 855-633-6835 for assistance.

PLAN

Choose how you want to vote: absentee, in-person early voting (if offered by the county), or in-person on Election Day.

Remember to bring your valid form of identification! Digital versions of IDs cannot be used for voting.

VOTING IN PERSON

1. Go to vote.nd.gov/myvotinginfo to find polling location(s) information.
2. When you arrive at your polling location, a poll worker will verify your North Dakota ID and check you in.
3. Pick up a ballot at the judge's table.
4. Mark your ballot using a pen or the ExpressVote ballot marking device. If you make a mistake, you can ask for a new ballot up to two times.
5. Insert your marked ballot in the paper ballot tabulator and pick up your "I Voted" sticker!

BALLOT MARKING KNOW HOW

- You can skip voting for a race or a ballot measure.
- You can vote for fewer than the number indicated for a race. For instance, if the race says to choose 2 candidates, it is okay if you only select 1.
- In a Primary Election, you must vote for candidates in a single party for partisan races. If you vote for candidates in different parties, the partisan races on the ballot will not count. All other correctly marked nonpartisan races and ballot measures will count.



ABSENTEE BALLOTS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE CLOSE OF POLLS ON ELECTION DAY!

VOTING ABSENTEE

- You are never mailed a ballot without requesting one.
- In vote by mail counties, county auditors **mail** voting age residents an absentee ballot application.
- In all other counties, you must **request** an absentee ballot application from your county auditor or by going to vote.nd.gov/myvotinginfo.

CASTING YOUR ABSENTEE BALLOT

1. Fill out and return an absentee ballot application to your county auditor. The application can be found at vote.nd.gov/myvotinginfo.
2. If you meet voter qualifications and ID requirements, the county auditor will mail you a ballot.
3. Fill out the ballot and place it in the included return envelope.
4. Return your ballot by U.S. Postal Service, making sure to add correct postage. You can also place it in the secure county dropbox or hand deliver it to the county auditor's office. Allow enough time to make sure your ballot is received by the county auditor by close of polls on Election Day. Completed absentee ballots cannot be returned to a polling location.

PARTICIPATE

Go to the My Voting Info Portal and enter your address or ID information to access an absentee ballot application, polling location details, and a sample ballot.
