



VOTE WITH CONFIDENCE IN EVERY ELECTION!



If you've never voted before, haven't voted for a while, or are new to North Dakota, you might have questions about how to vote. The North Dakota Secretary of State's Office is here to be your source for trusted, reliable election information.

Visit vote.nd.gov for reliable information you can trust.

START

Make sure you meet the three voting requirements in North Dakota:

- You must be at least 18 years old
- You must be a U.S. citizen
- You must be a resident of North Dakota and your precinct for 30 days preceding Election Day



Find your polling location and decide how to get there.

Visit vote.nd.gov to see a sample ballot and what you are voting on.

Make sure you have a valid ID. These are:

- A North Dakota driver's license or a North Dakota non-driver ID card
- A long-term care certificate from a care facility; or
- A tribal ID or tribal letter

When you arrive at your polling location, a poll worker will verify your ID, ask if you meet the three voting requirements, and check you in.

Head to the judges' table to pick up a ballot.

Vote in a voting booth or use the ExpressVote.

Grab your "I VOTED" sticker.

Take your ballot to the paper ballot tabulator and insert.

Make a mistake? You can ask for a new ballot.
